

## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

### Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### **From Fabric A, cut:**

twenty-eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- fifty-six 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles
- fifty-six 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles
- one hundred sixty-eight 2-1/2" squares

### **From Fabric B, cut:**

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- one hundred twelve 2-1/2" squares

### **From Fabric C, cut:**

three 3-3/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- twenty-eight 3-3/8" squares for the SIAS units

### **From Fabric D, cut:**

twelve 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- one hundred twelve 2-7/8" squares for the flying geese units
- fifty-six 2-7/8" squares for the SIAS units. Cut each square in half along one diagonal to create one hundred twelve triangles.

### **From Fabric E, cut:**

four 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- twenty-eight 5-1/4" squares for the flying geese units

### **From Fabric F, cut:**

six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

- two 1-1/2" x 58-1/2" top/bottom inner borders
- two 1-1/2" x 64-1/2" side inner borders

### **From Fabric G, cut:**

seven 5" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:


- two 5" x 67-1/2" top/bottom outer borders
- two 5" x 66-1/2" side outer borders

### **From the Binding Fabric, cut:**


eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Flying Geese Units


**Step 1:** Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric D squares in opposing corners of a 5-1/4" Fabric E square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.




**Step 2:** Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



**Step 3:** Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.



**Step 4:** Place one 2-7/8" Fabric D square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.



**Step 5:** Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.




**Step 6:** Repeat with all remaining 5-1/4" Fabric E squares to make a total of one hundred twelve flying geese blocks.

## Assemble the Square-in-a-Square Units

**Step 7:** Sew a Fabric D triangle to opposite sides of a 3-3/8" Fabric C square. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. Repeat on remaining sides of the Fabric C square. Trim the SIAS block to 4-1/2" square.



## Assemble the A Blocks




**Step 8:** Gather:  
four Fabric A squares  
four flying geese units  
one SIAS unit

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 9:** Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams away from the flying geese units.

**Step 10:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting A Block should measure 8-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty-eight A Blocks.



## Assemble the B Blocks


**Step 11:** Gather:  
two Fabric B squares  
two Fabric A squares

Arrange two A and two B squares to form a four-patch. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 12:** Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the darker fabric. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block center.




**Step 13:** With the four-patch positioned as shown, sew the 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric A rectangles to the left and right edges of the unit. Press.



**Step 14:** Sew a Fabric B square to the end of a 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Press. Repeat to make a second unit like this, and sew them to the top and bottom of the unit in the orientation shown. Press.



The resulting B Block should measure 8-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty-eight B Blocks.



## Assemble the Quilt

**Step 15:** Arrange the A and B Blocks into eight rows of seven blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.


**Step 16:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

**Step 17:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

**Step 18:** Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 19:** Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!



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
