Constructing inner border \#5 pieced block

1. Flying geese unit. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric 1 square. Place square, right sides together, at a corner of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ background rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim $1 / 4$ " away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle. Repeat with (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2$ " Fabric 2 square at the opposite corner of the same rectangle to make (1) flying geese unit.


Make (1) flying geese unit for the following Fabric 1 / Fabric 2 fabric combinations:

2. Refer to block diagram below, and noting the fabric placement, sew (2) step 1 flying geese units to the opposite sides of (1) $41 / 2 " \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ print square to make a row unit.


Sew (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background squares to the opposite sides of (1) step 1 flying geese unit to make a row unit. Make a total of (2) row units.

3. Sew together step 2 row units to complete (1) pieced block. Sew (2) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background rectangles to the opposite sides of star unit, followed by (2) $11 / 2$ " $\times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background rectangles to the remaining opposite sides of star unit to complete (1) pieced block.

4. Make a total of (4) pieced blocks for each of the following fabric print:


## Quilt Top Assembly

1. Inner border \#1. Sew (2) $13 / 4$ " $\times 361 / 2$ " background strips to the opposite sides of Fabric U quilt center, followed by (2) $13 / 4$ " X 39" background strips to the remaining opposite sides of quilt center.
2. Inner border \#2. Sew (2) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 39^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $J$ strips to the opposite sides of quilt center, followed by (2) $11 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 401 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strips to the remaining opposite sides of quilt center.

3. Inner border \#3. Arrange and sew together (20) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of assorted prints to make a column unit. Make (2) column units, and sew units along the long sides to make a pieced column. Make a total of (2) pieced columns, and sew to the left and right sides of quilt center.

Arrange and sew together (24) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of assorted prints to make a row unit. Make (2) row units, and sew units along the long sides to make a pieced row. Make a total of (2) pieced rows, and sew to the top and bottom of quilt center.

4. Inner border \#4. Sew (2) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 481 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strips to the opposite sides of quilt center, followed by (2) $11 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strips to the remaining opposite sides of quilt center.

5. Inner border \#5. Arrange and sew (5) pieced blocks to make a pieced column. Make (2) pieced columns and sew to the opposite sides of quilt center.

Arrange and sew (7) pieced blocks to make a pieced row. Make (2) pieced rows and sew to the remaining opposite sides of quilt center.

6. Outer border. Sew (2) $31 / 2 " \times 701 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strips to the opposite sides of quilt center, followed by (2) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 761 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the remaining opposite sides of quilt center to complete quilt top.


Finishing

1. Layer backing, batting and quilt top.
2. Baste the layers together. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind to complete the quilt.
