

SPONTANEOUS TWIRL QUILT PATTERN

Materials and Cutting			
Fabric		Yardage	Cutting
	Jax Stella-1560 Marshmallow	1 ³ / ₄ yards	Cut: 8 strips, 7" x width of fabric (WOF). Sub-cut 40 A squares, 7" x 7".
	Moonscape Stella-1150 Allure	1 ¹ / ₄ yards	Cut: 2 strips, 7" x WOF. Sub-cut 6 E squares, 7" x 7", and 2 B squares, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ ". 1 strip, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Sub-cut 10 B squares, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ ". 8 strips, 2 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF, for binding.
	Moonscape Stella-1150 Ambrosia	3 ³ / ₄ yards <i>each</i>	From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 2 strips, 7" x WOF. Sub-cut 8 E squares, 7" x 7". 2 strips, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Sub-cut 20 B squares, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ ".

	Moonscape Stella-1150 Azalea	5 ⁵ / ₈ yard <i>each</i>	From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 2 strips, 7" x WOF. Sub-cut 6 E squares, 7" x 7", and 2 B squares, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ ". 1 strip, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Sub-cut 10 B squares, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ ".

	Country Picnic Stella-DCWR2132 White	1 ¹ / ₃ yard <i>each</i>	From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 1 strip, 9 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Sub-cut 3 C rectangles, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 9 ¹ / ₂ ", and 6 D squares, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ ".

	Lemons Stella-DCWR2131 White		
	Plumbago Stella-DCWR2129 Purple		
	Bouquets Stella-DCWR2135 Multi	1 ¹ / ₃ yard <i>each</i>	From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 1 strip, 9 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Sub-cut 4 C rectangles, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 9 ¹ / ₂ ", and 8 D squares, 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ ".
	Posies Stella-DCWR2130 Raspberry		
	Magnolias Stella-DCWR2133 Marina	3 ⁷ / ₈ yards	Remove selvages and cut yardage into two equal lengths for backing.



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SPONTANEOUS TWIRL QUILT PATTERN

Note: All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless otherwise specified, and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise instructed. Each block is made from three fabrics.


Make the Blocks

1 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each **A** square. Place one marked **A** square right sides together with one **E** square, aligning outer edges. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the marked line. Cut along the marked line and press the seams open. Trim each half-square triangle (HST) to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square, centering the seam along the diagonal center. Make a total of 80 **A/E** HST.





2 Referring to the quilt image for fabric combinations, sew matching **B** squares to each end of a **C** rectangle. Press the seam allowances toward the rectangle. Make a total of 20 **B/C/B** units.







B/C/B unit

3 Referring to the quilt image for fabric combinations, sew a **B** square to a **D** square. Press the seam allowances toward the **D** square. Make a total of 40 **B/D** units.




B/D unit

4 Noting orientation, arrange 2 matching HST and 1 matching **B/D** unit in a single vertical row as shown. Sew the elements together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances toward the **B/D** unit. Make a total of 40 vertical rows.

5 Noting orientation, arrange 2 matching vertical rows on either side of a matching **B/C/B** unit. Sew the elements together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances toward the **B/C/B** unit to complete the block. The block should measure $15\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $15\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make a total of 20 blocks.

Assemble the Quilt

1 Referring to the quilt photo for block placement, arrange the blocks in 5 rows of 4 blocks each. Sew the blocks in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in each row in one direction, alternating the direction from row to row.

2 Join the rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seams in one direction.

Finishing

1 Using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance, join the two large backing rectangles along one long edge to complete the quilt backing. Press.

2 Layer the quilt backing, batting, and quilt top. Quilt as desired. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the edge around the perimeter of the quilt. Trim the excess backing and batting. Use your favorite method to bind the quilt.
