BULLSEYE QUILT PATTERN

| Materials and Cutting | | |

| Fabric | Yardage | Cutting |
|  Moonscape Stella-1150 Marlin | 2 ¹ / ₄ yards | Cut: 7 strips, 8 ¹ / ₂ " × width of fabric (WOF). Sub-cut 20 A squares, 8 ¹ / ₂ " × 8 ¹ / ₂ ", and 25 B rectangles, 2 ¹ / ₂ " × 8 ¹ / ₂ ". 6 strips, 2 ¹ / ₂ " × WOF. Sub-cut 6 sashing strips, 2 ¹ / ₂ " × 42 ¹ / ₂ ". |
|  Poncho Stella-1955 Multi | 5/8 yard | Cut: 2 ¹ / ₄ "-wide bias strips to make 200" of bias binding |
|  Wanted Stella-1950 Gardenia | | |
|  High Noon Stella-1954 Misty | 1/4 yard <i>each</i> | From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 4 circles, using the circle template*. |
|  Skull Bandana Stella-1956 Azure | | |
|  Brewskis Stella-1953 Biscotti | 1/4 yard <i>each</i> | |
|  The Wild West Stella-1957 Vulcan | | From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 3 circles, using the circle template*. |
|  Western Skulls Stella-1951 Multi | 1/4 yard | Cut: 2 circles, using the circle template*. |
|  Gallop Stella-1952 Gardenia | 2 ³ / ₄ yards | Remove selvages. Cut a strip, 36" × WOF, from yardage. Sub-cut the 36" backing into two 20" × 36" rectangles. |

| Batting | 50" × 60" | |
| Double-sided fusible web, optional | 4 yards, based on a 17"-width | |
| Template Plastic, optional | 8" × 8" | |

*See "Preparation on page 3 for instructions on completing the circle template. Before cutting fabric, add a 1/4" seam allowance to the circle template if using a traditional applique method. If using a fusible applique technique, follow the manufacturer's instructions to apply fusible web to the wrong side of the fabric before cutting circle appliques.



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BULLSEYE QUILT PATTERN


Note: All seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise specified. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.

Preparation


1 Print two copies of the circle template on page 4. Measure the test square to make sure the templates print at actual size. Trim one template along the straight edge and tape the two pieces of the template together along the line as indicated to make a complete circle template. Add a 1/4" seam allowance to the template if using a traditional applique technique.

Make the Bullseye Blocks


1 Fold one **A** square in half once horizontally and once vertically. Finger press the folded edge to mark the center of the square.



2 Using the circle template to locate the exact center of a circle, and with both the **A** square and the circle right side up, match the center of a circle with the center of the marked **A** square. Pin the circle in place on the square.



Use your favorite applique technique to either fuse or sew the circle in place on the square. Use a decorative stitch to either hand or machine sew around the perimeter of the circle. Make a total of 20 Bullseye Blocks.




Bullseye Block

Assemble the Quilt

1 Referring to the quilt photo for fabric placement, alternate four Bullseye Blocks and five **B** rectangles in a single horizontal row. Join the blocks and rectangles together along adjacent edges. Press. Make five block rows.

2 Place a sashing strip between each block row. Sew the sashing strips and block rows together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in one direction.

3 Sew one sashing strip to the upper edge and another to the lower edge of the quilt top. Press the seam allowances in one direction.

Finishing

① Using a 1/2" seam allowance, join the two large backing rectangles along one short edge. Press. Sew the joined rectangles to the remaining backing yardage along one long edge. Press. Trim the rectangles even with the yardage to complete the quilt backing. Press.

② Layer the quilt backing, batting, and quilt top. Quilt as desired. Stitch a scant 1/4" from the edge around the perimeter of the quilt. Trim the excess backing and batting. Use your favorite method to bind the quilt.

This square should measure
1" x 1"
(2.5 cm x 2.5 cm)
when printed.
