Finished quilt size: 41" x 58"

Fabric Requirements

1 panel ($\frac{2}{3}$ yard) Panel-CD8946 Aqua
1 $\frac{3}{8}$ yards Flora-CD8947 Aqua
1 $\frac{1}{8}$ yards Block-C8400 White
(includes $\frac{1}{2}$ yard for binding)
2 $\frac{3}{4}$ yards Flora-CD8948 Aqua
49" \times 66" batting

Cutting

From the Panel-CD8946 Aqua:

- Center the motif and trim the panel to 23" \times 40".

From Flora-CD8947 Aqua:

- Centering on the floral motif, cut two 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 46" strips lengthwise (outer side borders).
- Centering on the floral motif, cut two 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 29" strips lengthwise (outer top/bottom borders).
- Centering on the floral motif, cut two 7" squares (A).

From Block-C8400 White:


- Cut one 7" \times width-of-fabric (WOF) strip. Sub-cut two 7" squares (B).
- Cut four 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times WOF strips. Trim two strips to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 40" (inner side borders) and trim the remaining two strips to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 29" (inner top/bottom borders).
- Cut six 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " \times WOF binding strips.

Block Construction

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together.

1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each B square. Match an A square and B square right sides together. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " on both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the marked line. Press open and trim to 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square (figure 1). Make a total of four half-square triangles (HST).

Quilt Top Assembly

2. Stitch one inner side border strip to each side of the center panel.
3. Stitch one inner top/bottom border strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the center panel.
4. Stitch an outer side border strip to each side of the quilt center.
5. Following Figure 2 for block orientation, stitch an HST to each end of an outer top/bottom border strip. Make two.

6. Noting the orientation, stitch one top/bottom row to the top and the other to the bottom of the quilt center completing the quilt top.

Finishing

7. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing, and quilt as desired.
8. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
9. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.

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
