Finished quilt size: 44" x 64"

Fabric Requirements

One panel ($\frac{2}{3}$ yard) Panel-CM1560 Black
1/4 yard Plume-CM1570 Black
1/3 yard Fleur-CM1009 Peacock
1/2 yard Fleur-CM1009 Sky
3/4 yard Mix-C7200 Black
2 yards Plume-CM1562 Black
3 yards backing fabric of your choice
52" x 72" batting

Cutting

From Panel-CM1560 Black:

- Trim panel to 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

From Plume-CM1570 Black:

- Cut four 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x width-of-fabric (WOF) strips for border 2.

From Fleur-CM1009 Peacock:

- Cut six 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for border 5.

From Fleur-CM1009 Sky:

- Cut eight 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for borders 1 and 3.

From Mix-C7200 Black:

- Cut six 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for border 6.
- Cut six 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for binding.

From Plume-CM1562 Black:

- Cut four matching 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x length-of-fabric (LOF) strips for border 4. See the quilt photo for the design placement.

Quilt Top Assembly

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press the seam allowances toward the borders after each addition.


1. For border 1, sew the eight 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF CM1009 Sky strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Cut two 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths and sew one to each side of the CM1560 Black panel. Cut two 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths and sew one to the top and the other to the bottom. Save the remaining pieced strip for border 3.
2. For border 2, sew the four 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF CM1570 Black strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and cut two border strips that length. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut two border strips that length and sew one to the top and the other to the bottom.
3. Repeat step 2 with the remaining 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF CM1009 Sky long strip to add border 3.
4. For border 4, sew the 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF CM1562 Black strips together in pairs using diagonal seams. Mark the quilt center along the sides, top and bottom. Mark the center of each border strip. Matching the centers, sew each border strip in place, beginning and ending precisely $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the corners. DO NOT trim the extra length.



Imagination... Passion... Creativity

- To miter the borders, fold one corner of the quilt on a 45° angle so that the border strips are directly on top of one another and the seams nest together. Place your rotary ruler on the fold of the quilt so that the long edge is against the fold and the 45° line is on the side of the seam. Draw a line from the corner of the quilt top to the outside edge of the border. Pin the borders together. Position your needle on the inside corner where the border meets the quilt. Stitch directly on the line to the outside edge of the border. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (*figure 1*). Press. Repeat the process for the remaining three corners of the quilt.

- Repeat step 2 with the six 1½" × WOF CM1009 Peacock strips to make and add border 5.
- Repeat step 2 with the six 1½" × WOF C7200 Black strips to make and add border 6.

Finishing

- Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing, and quilt as desired.
- Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
- Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.

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
